O'Connor Sues Drake-Chenault; Counter Complaint To Be Filed

O'Connor Creative Services has filed suit against Drake-Chenault Enterprises for \$210,000 in damages arising from Drake-Chenault's al-

leged failure to deliver "The New History of Rock & Roll" to the syndicated program distributors by fall 1976. The complaint cites

almost \$100,000 in contracts with radio stations allegedly signed in reliance upon the fall delivery date, and claims losses of hundreds of thousands in prospective sales, as well as damage to O'Connor's reputation.

R&R has learned that Drake-Chenault will be filing a cross-complaint against O'Connor for monies owed, and that all aspects of the O'Connor complaint are denied by Drake-Chenault. According to Drake-Chenault spokesman Alvin Midler, "The New History of Rock & Roll" is going ahead on schedule, and because of the highly creative nature of the program, time has never been a concern, only the excellence of the program."

'Magic' Is Gone For Globe In Settlement

Greater Media, Inc., and Globe Broadcasting have reached a settlement in their dispute over service mark infringements (as reported in R&R). Greater Media had sued Globe for its use of its service mark "Magic Radio" to identify **WMGC/Cleveland**, claiming infringement on its own "Magic" marks, used to identify **WMGK/Philadelphia** and **WMJC/Detroit** and Greater Media's national music syndication service. Globe in turn sued Greater Media

on similar grounds. Neither party admitted any infringement, but under the out of court settlement, Globe will cease using the word "Magic" in its promotions within 90 days and will abandon a pending application to register "Magic Radio" as a service mark. Greater Media, meanwhile, agreed not to license its "Magic Music" syndication service in Cleveland for six months.

FCC Questions KRLA Interim Operators

The FCC has asked the Oak Knoll Company, for over a decade the interim operator of KRLA/Los Angeles, to show cause why it should not have its interim license revoked. The company will be questioned about a charge that its officers, directors, or members of the board have appropriated for their personal use funds earmarked for charity during the period of their interim operation. Oak Knoll has administered KRLA since the mid-60's after the previous operators' license was revoked. Numerous applications by other groups for the KRLA license have been turned down by the FCC during this period.

20th Century Restrains Springboard Records On 'Star Wars' LP

Twentieth Century-Fox Films and Twentieth Century Records won a temporary restraining order against Springboard Records enjoining Springboard from distributing its "Star Wars" LP. The action alleged that the Springboard album's jacket, packaging and advertising are designed to convince potential buyers that they are getting the original soundtrack album, available on Twentieth. Such simulation, according to Twentieth, infringes on copyright and qualifies as unfair competition.

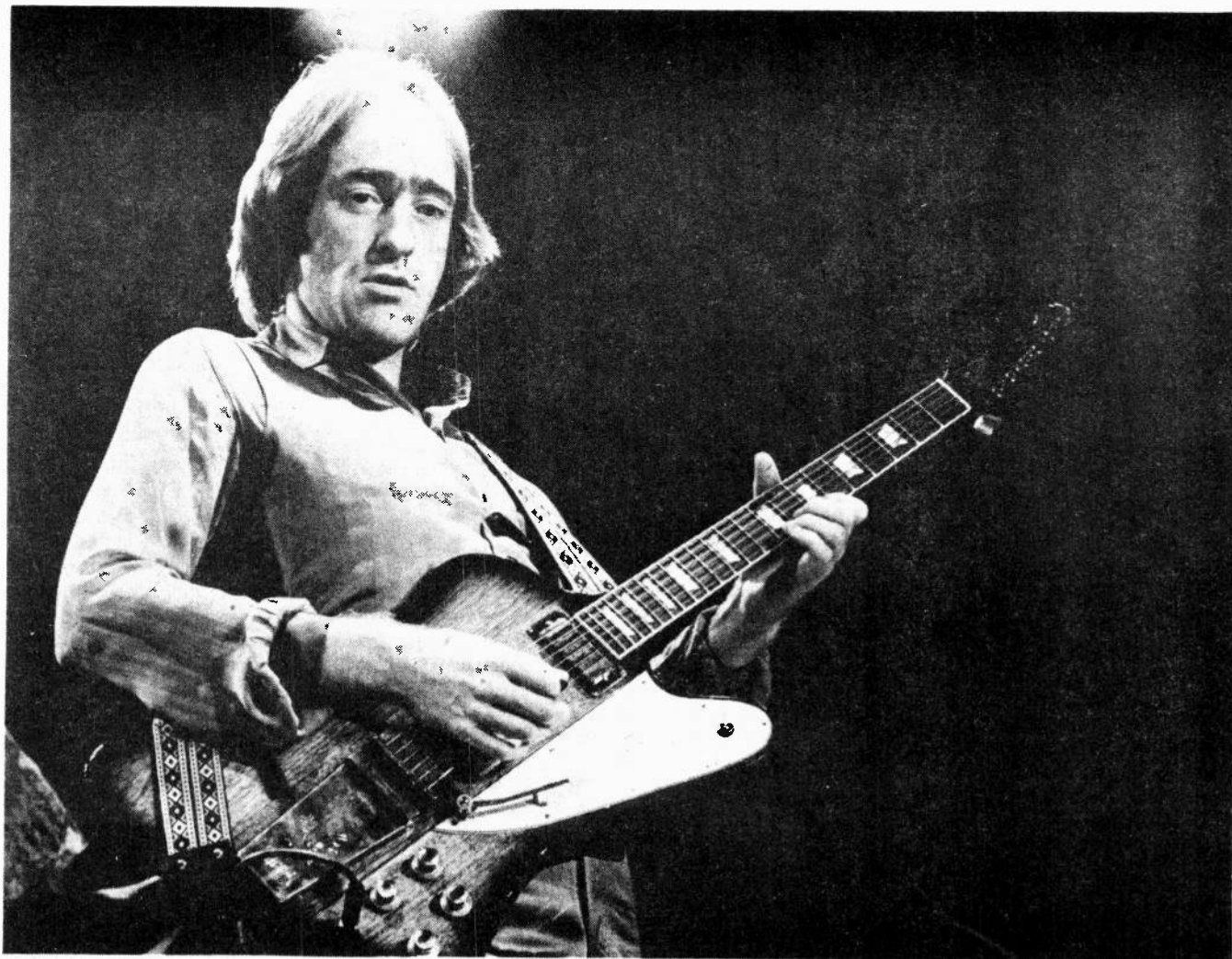

FCC Begins Inquiry On Quadraphonic And Stereo Broadcast Standards

The FCC is launching an inquiry on the issue of adopting standards for FM quadraphonic radio broadcasting, in response to three separate petitions. The inquiry would determine whether there was sufficient public and

industry interest to warrant adopting standards.

A number of issues would be considered by the commission. The inquiry would compare the merits of the three existing quadraphonic transmission systems:

discreet four-channel "4-4-4"; "4-3-4," four channel broadcasting achieved by combining the audio channel into three signals later to be decoded in the receiver back into four; and "4-2-4," four channels encoded into two signals transmitted as left and right stereophonic signals, later decoded in the receiver back to four.

Other issues include the evaluation of several quadraphonic systems designed by manufacturers; the ability of present receivers to function normally in the presence of quadraphonic broadcasting; whether present receivers could be practically modified for quadraphonic; and costs and industry/public interest.

The commission stated that "the adoption of standards for each of the quadraphonic systems might create problems or produce less than optimum sound reproduction or station coverage." Broadcasters should consider, the statement continued, "the effects on station coverage, protection ratios, increased occupied bandwidth and multipath that are characteristics of 4-4-4, 4-3-4 and 4-2-4 systems."

The commission urged "radio equipment manufacturers, broadcasters, and the listening public" to make their interests known and to "contribute relevant information" to assist in the inquiry. Comments are due by September 15, replies October 17.

The FCC also announced the opening of an inquiry into AM stereophonic broadcasting, covering substantially the same ground as in the quadraphonic inquiry. The new action was taken in response to petitions which claimed that AM stereo conversion could be achieved at minimal cost to listeners, and that AM radio stations were at a disadvantage in competing with FM stereo outlets. Comments are due October 15, replies November 15.

NABET Compromises On ABC Strike Demands

NABET, on strike against the ABC network for over a month, stated that it had made compromise offers to ABC in a one-hour Washington D.C. negotiation meeting. The network negotiating team was to study the proposals last weekend. No new sessions have been scheduled, but progress is reportedly expected this week when ABC makes its counterproposals.

NBC's WYNY To Remain Separate

WYNY-FM, the NBC network's FM outlet in New York will remain a separate entity, according to General Manager Stanley Cohen. The station will retain its Soft-Rock format, and will be unaffected by the recent network changes (R&R 6/24) which brought Charley Warner and Bob Pittman in to oversee WNBC-AM's operations. No programming changes are planned at WYNY.

Multimedia Expands

Multimedia, Inc., has agreed in principle to purchase WEZW-FM/Milwaukee for a price in the area of \$3 million. Multimedia present-

ly owns five FM stations, with a sixth purchase pending. The company also operates seven AM stations and five television facilities.

CLASSICAL GAS



Nonesuch Records and the Milwaukee Peaches Records store co-sponsored a first in classical music last Friday night. In a promotion designed to "take it to the streets" the entire Milwaukee Symphony Orchestra performed for 500 people at the store in suburban Silver Springs. Originally the event had been planned for the Peaches parking lot but rain intervened. At the last minute, employees, some in tuxedos, swiftly cleared an entire section of the store to accommodate the 80 musicians and their instruments. AOR WQFM-FM/Milwaukee donated radio time to advertise the concert. The station had commemorative T-shirts made up featuring its call letters and the Milwaukee Symphony, Peaches and Nonesuch logos. WQFM also supplied orchids for the first hundred females to arrive. Air personalities Bobby Rivers and Paul Kelly, who helped organize the concert, also made appearances. WFMR-FM, Milwaukee's Classical music radio station, ran spots and sent announcer Obie Yadgar to emcee the show. Nonesuch donated promotional albums which were given as bonuses for season ticket purchases for the Milwaukee Symphony, and local television and newspaper media covered the event. The air conditioning was taxed beyond its capacity, and by the end of the performance, the musicians had forsaken their tuxedos and ties and were playing in shirtsleeves.

Kiernan To Phonodisc

Jack Kiernan, who resigned as Vice President of Marketing at RCA last week (R&R 6-24), has been appointed Vice President of Sales at Phonodisc, the distributing arm of the Polygram Group. Kiernan had been with RCA for six years, previously having work-

ed for Project 3, Kapp, and Decca.

Phonodisc, which distributes Polydor, RSO, Mercury, and Island among others, also has promoted Richard Carter to the position of Vice President, Product Development.

LaRosa Resigns From WNEW

Julius LaRosa, WNEW-AM/New York air personality for the past eight years, has resigned from the station. LaRosa, a popular vocalist in the 50's, stated "While my relations with WNEW have been very pleasant, they are at the same time restrictive. Being on the air six days a week precluded my doing other things that I am anxious to

do." WNEW PD Dean Tyler commented, "Although I've been here only a few weeks, it took considerably less time than that for me to recognize the warmth and cooperative spirit of Julie. We wish him well as he pursues his desire to expand in other areas of entertainment."

FCC Payola Probe To Press On Without Press

The FCC's ongoing payola hearings will be conducted behind closed doors henceforth. A 6-1 commission vote adopted the no-press policy after FCC attorneys complained that press coverage intimidated potential witnesses

from testifying. The hearings, which up till now have concentrated on alleged abuses by WOL/Washington staffers, will reportedly examine Los Angeles record company practices in the near future.

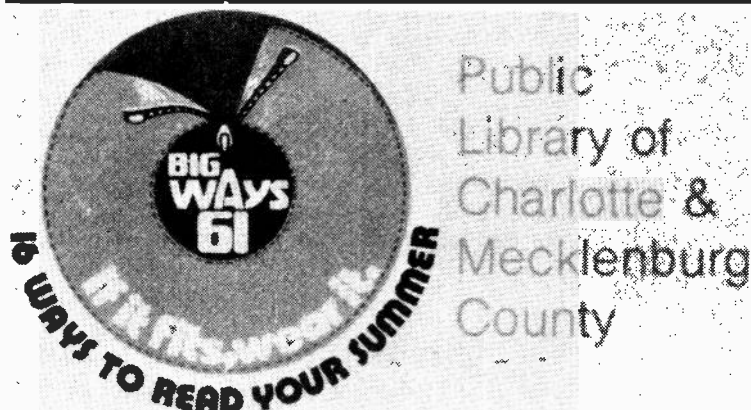
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Pete Gidion Named Associate Director, Natl. Promotion At Epic

they've checked out and (presumably) read. Those students who collect 15 such notches and a librarian's validating signature can take their cards to WAYS and exchange them for either six singles or an album.

Farrah Cracks 7 Million

Farrah Fawcett-Majors and her red bathing suit are now in the hands of over seven million Americans, according to Pro-Art Inc., the Farrah poster distribution outlet. Her wide smile is now going worldwide as well, and the company expects that she will maintain her number one poster-selling pace in the months to come.

Actors Group Reprimands Anita Bryant

The council of Actors' Equity Association has reprimanded Anita Bryant, who is a member of that organization, for her outspoken campaign against homosexuals. Ms. Bryant received a formal letter from the organization's Executive Secretary, who stated that the AEA has always taken a strong stand against discrimination in any form and antidiscrimination clauses are included in the performer's union contracts.

Radio Over 8000 Strong

The Federal Communications Commission notes that a total of 8322 AM and FM radio stations were on the air in the U.S. in May. Of these, 4500 were AM signals. 985 television stations were on the air by the end of that month.

Car Expenses Up

American motorists are now spending over 20 cents per mile to operate their automobiles, according to a Hertz Corp. study. At 20.1¢ per mile, the yearly cost of \$1,812 was average for a car owner in 1976. The previous year, average spending was 18.9¢ per mile, or \$1,682. This increase doesn't seem so bad until you consider that in 1950 drivers were averaging 8¢ per mile of driving distance.

Instant Beer?

A Japanese-developed instant powdered beer may be distributed here if Global Marketing Services receives federal approval. Also in line for Global's marketing are powdered mixes for wine and cocktails. Liquid alcohol is encased in particles of a flavoring agent, so all the consumer has to do is add water and drink.

Car Buyers Want "The Blues"

Consumers in the market for new or used cars now favor the color blue over the long-standing favorite of white, according to a study by the Dupont Co. Specifically, the middle-blue color range is now the most popular.

Execs Go For Stock Appreciation

New executive pay plans are increasingly including stock appreciation rights offered to shareholders. The profits that stock in a company produces are paid to the shareholders without requiring the executives to purchase the security. Of 133 new plans examined by a brokerage house, 40% included such a policy.

\$8 Million To Push New "Maxie"

Max Factor's latest cosmetic push will be a fragrance, "Just Call Me Maxie." Massive sample mailings will back up a multi-media push, with the total campaign reaching the \$8 million mark. The fall introduction may be increased with a holiday push to include radio buys.

Radio To Help "New York, New York"

Twenty-one different radio commercials have been produced to help push United Artists' film "New York, New York" in Los Angeles. Among these spots are several two-minute commercials, which will be scheduled on every station in the market. The movie introduction took place last week, and will go city-wide in mid-July. Extensive print ads will back up the saturation radio effort.

The "Mouth Whack" Rolls Out

Breath mint "Tic Tac" has taken on a new twist in their advertising push, offering consumers a "Mouth Whack" every time they pop one in their mouths. The \$1.5 million ad budget will be spread over three months on radio and TV, with spots depicting people getting their mouths "whacked" in different situations.

FCC PROVIDES FOR PUBLIC ACCESS TO PROGRAM LOG DATA

FCC has amended its Rules to require Radio Broadcasters to make their Program Logs and/or Log data available for public inspection, and to also make such material, as well as public inspection file material, available for reproduction. However, FCC concluded it would **not** require Station retention of Transcripts, Tapes or Disc Recordings of News and Public Affairs Programs.

EFFORTS TOWARD POSSIBLE NEW FCC FEE SCHEDULE

There seems to be a definite effort, both in Congress and from the General Accounting Office, to require FCC to establish a new Fee Schedule along the lines of that one it had previously, but which was subsequently thrown out by the Courts. Up to now, FCC has resisted such efforts and has concluded that it cannot develop any such rational Fee Schedule that the Courts will not reject on appeal. But it may, under these new pressures, take the initiative to try to develop a substitute Fee Schedule to replace its earlier ones. It's at least clear that the Communications Industry has not heard the last of Fee charges by the FCC as all had hoped would be the case only a short time ago. The status of claims for reimbursement of earlier Fee payments is in this situation quite problematic, and without any certain outcome at this time.

The Nielsens showed NBC as the top network, however, with a 24.1 rating, followed by CBS with 14.1 and ABC with 13.6. After the Angels, the rest of the top rated shows were: NBC's "The War Between The Tates," "Laverne & Shirley," "Happy Days," "Kojak," "McCloud," "MASH," "Shields & Yarnell," CBS special "6 Rms Rv Vu," and "Quincy."

New York viewers' TV favorites, according to Arbitron's meter service were: 1) "Charlie's Angels," "Happy Days," and "Laverne & Shirley" tied, 4) "Shields & Yarnell," 5) "NBC Monday Movie," 6) one of the few daytime sports events to come into the top 10 in some time, the running of the Belmont Stakes horse race, 7) a four way tie between "All In The Family," "Barney Miller," "Kojak," and "What's Happening." TV Business

CBS has announced that it expects to take a loss on their showing of the movie "Network," which they acquired for \$5 million. CBS President Robert Wussler noted that many special programs, including sports events, are currently losing money because of high acquisition prices...Citing high production costs and small revenues for afternoon children's shows, Walt Disney Productions has said that they will cancel their "New Mickey Mouse Club" series starting next season...The possibility of an AFTRA strike against the three major networks came about at the closing of the union's annual convention in San Francisco. The current contract is over as of today (7/1). Negotiations for the prime-time drama contract are being held now. Screen Actors Guild members will also be polled on the strike issue...NBC has announced that President Carter will speak to the younger generation of Americans on a special children's TV show. His daughter Amy was scheduled to get in on the panel discussion as well, but NBC has now said that she will not appear with her father...An hour long David Soul special will be sponsored by Pentel of America late this summer to kick off the pen company's largest back to school campaign in their history. Produced by Dick Clark, the show will air August 18 on ABC. Other artists scheduled to appear with Soul are England Dan & John Ford Coley and Donna Summer.

KYYX "96Kicks"/Seattle's Robin Mitchell told R&R about their very unique Father's Day promotion. Listeners were offered the opportunity to "Win Your Dad A Tattoo." The winning father had his body custom tattooed with the word "Mom," and the listener's mother had the option of getting a matching skin design in the slogan of her choice. **KFRC/San Francisco's "Summer Sunspot Spectaculars"** first phase has just been completed at the 4th annual International Waterski Jumping Championships at Marine World/Africa U.S.A. After hearing clues on the air, listeners called in to identify various "sunspot" cities in Northern California. "Sunspot" winners received a pair of passes for one year to the park. Additionally, every two hours a "sunburst" bonus prize of a waterski lesson was awarded. Once per day, a "water sport" kit was given away, containing a pair of waterskis, safety vest and ski tow rope. A drawing of all these winners was held for the grand prize of a \$500 ski board complete with engine, trailer, waterskis and all the accessories. 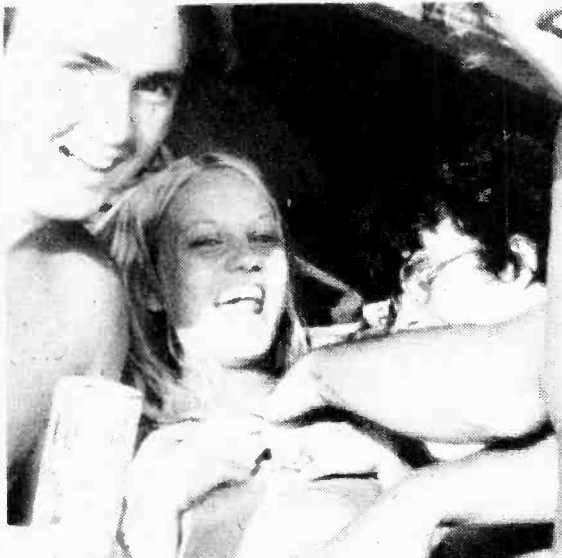

regarded as a pioneer of AOR broadcasting in Arizona, first at **KCAC/Phoenix**, where he was Station Manager, then at **KDKB**.

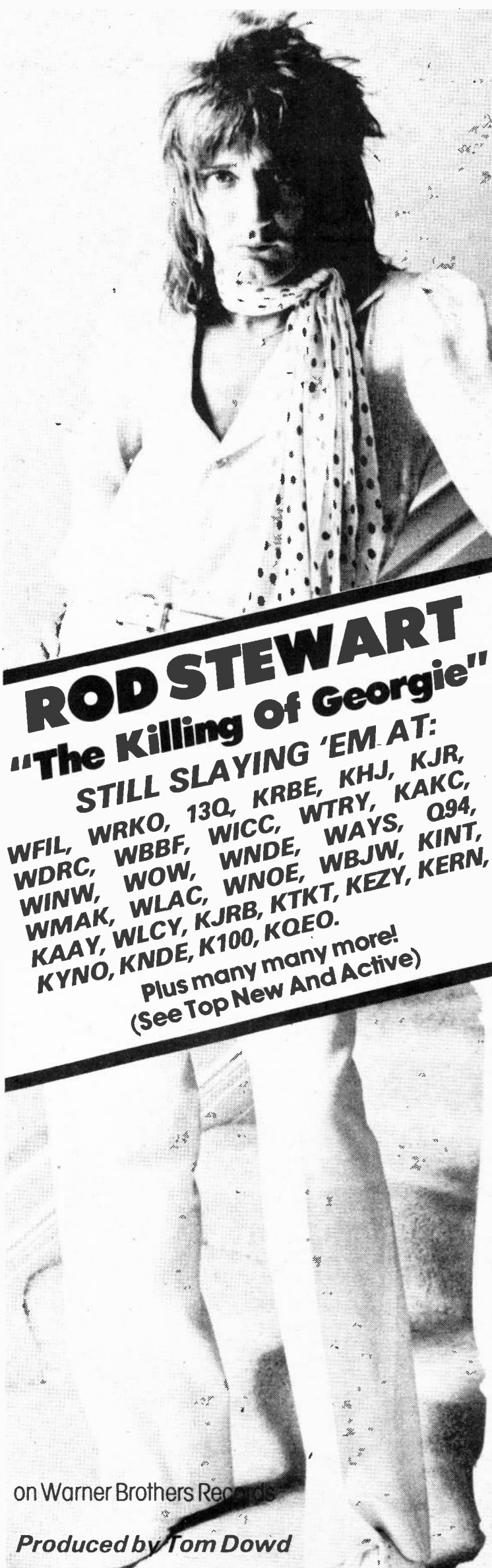
In memory of Compton, **KDKB** presented a special one-hour do-

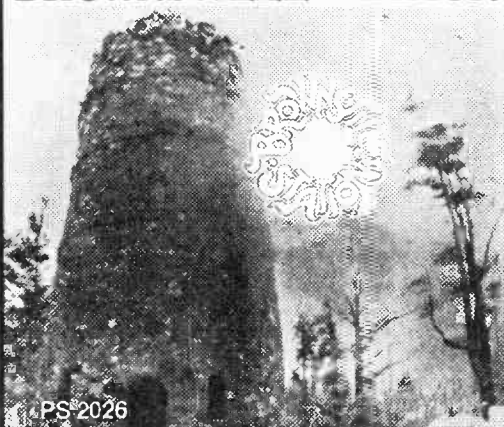

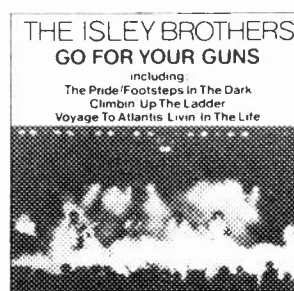

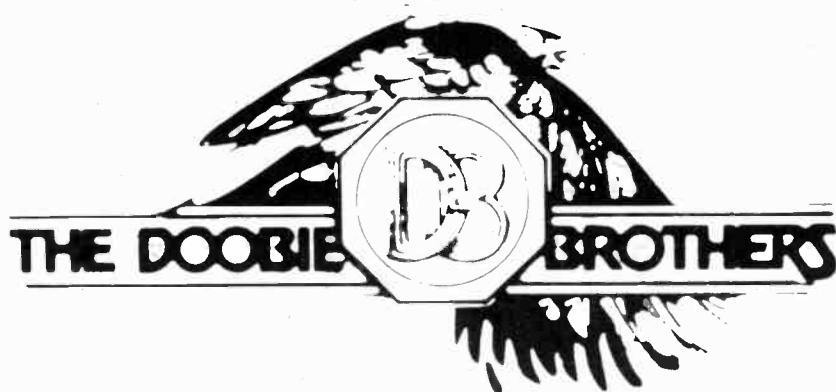

Parallels

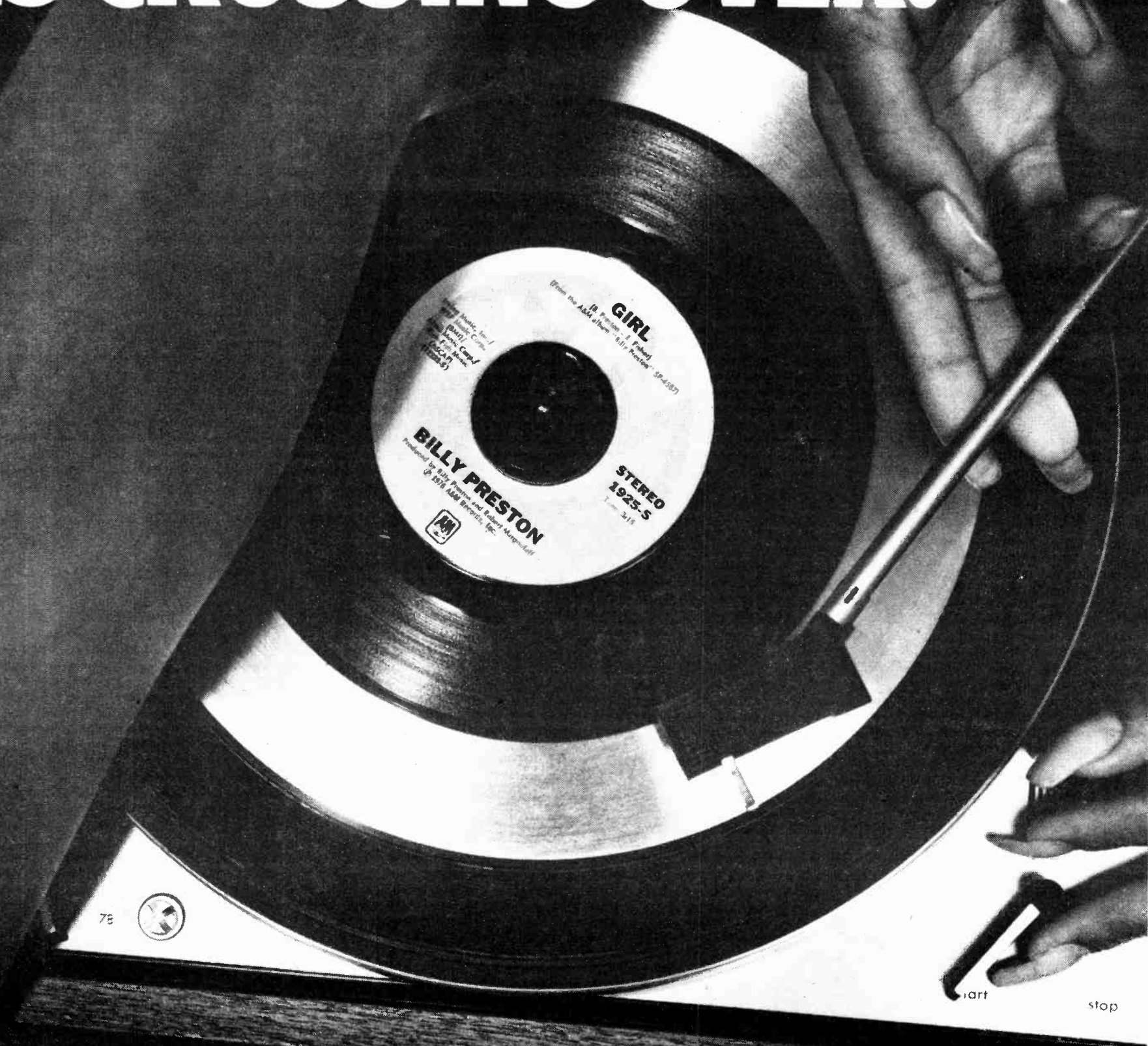

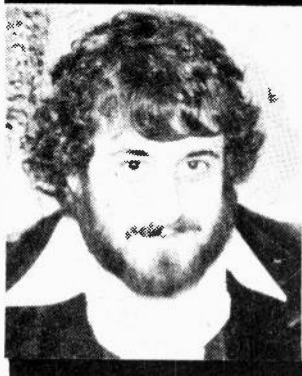

WBCN PD Quick Change

After 3½ months in the position, Bob Shannon has resigned the Program Directorship of WBCN/Boston to accept the morning show at KZEW/Dallas. WBCN General Manager Klee Dobra has named Tommy Hedges as the new PD, upped from within.

Shannon told R&R, "Texas is a feeling and I miss it. WBCN has been one of the most interesting and fulfilling things that I've ever done, even though it's only been a short period of time. The decision was made with the realization that in order for me to reach my full happiness potential as a human being I must follow my heart. I look forward to returning home to Dallas and joining a radio station that I've respected for a long time. In discussions with Ira Lipson (KZEW Station Manager/Chief Zoologist) I feel a potential exists at KZEW to continue my growth in both professional and personal areas. I leave WBCN and Boston aware that progress has been made and confident in the in-roads that have been made."

Shannon was Music Director and morning man at KAFM/Dallas prior to joining WBCN.

In appointing Hedges to the position left vacant by Shannon, Klee Dobra told R&R, "Tommy Hedges has been with us for 7 years, most recently in a Program Coordination capacity. It's a good step for him. He will continue the programming concepts already underway. Bob (Shannon) has done a hell of a job. We're sorry to see him go, but wish him well. He will be working for a while with Tommy, getting him ready, and will be available on call after he's gone should advice be needed."

Tim Hodges is doing 6-midnight....Kevin Clark is now Public Affairs Director; Kevin Carroll has become Promotion Director; and Mike Butscher takes over the all-night shift at WYDD/Pittsburgh....New AOR Station: Beautiful Music formatted WVLC-FM/Orleans, Mass. has become AOR formatted WLOM-FM.

Color

Free Music: KFYE/Fresno is running a promotion in which they'll be giving away "24 Hours of Free Music" on July 4th. Actually that translates into an album giveaway of 36 LP's. For the entire week leading up to Independence Day, the station is giving away "1000 Minutes of Music" per day. That's 25 albums.

Astronomy: KLBJ/Austin, with the help of the University of Texas McDonald Observatory, is presenting a regularly programmed feature called "Have You Seen The Stars Tonight?"

They Finally Lost One: The staff of Y-93/San Francisco with Bill Graham pitching lost a softball game against Banana Records 21-15.

More Jazz: KQ98/Omaha is presenting a series of live Jazz concerts at the Orpheum Theatre. Among the artists to be presented are Buddy Rich, Lionel Hampton, and Glen Miller.

Local Bands have the opportunity to play in WILS/Lansing free outdoor concerts. According to PD Dave Lange the bands bring tapes of their music to the station for consideration and the station provides the sound and audience for those qualifying. The last one drew 4000 listeners. The station also devoted an entire day to playing the "101 Favorite Album Cuts In Lansing" based on listener lists sent in.

Cuba: WXRT/Chicago News Ace C.D. Jaco is on assignment to Havana to bring the Windy City a first-hand account of the current political, economic, and social conditions there. The assignment is culminating in a week long series of on-the-air reports analyzing changing Cuban/American relations.

WSHE/Miami reports that they are running a "Top Rock Search" promotion which is tied in with a national contest. The station is soliciting tapes from local acts from which they'll pick the 6 best. The 6 will then go on to Lakeland where they'll compete against local acts from other markets. The grand winner gets to appear on the Midnight Special.

Go-Carts: WYXE/Madison staffers Mike Tinnis, Jim McBean, and Harry challenged each other to a go-cart race which was turned into a rather entertaining promotion.

Amusement Park: WKDD/Akron presented their first "Free Summer Music Festival" at Chippewa Lake Amusement Park. The promotion featured a full day of free admission to the park along with live music by Mahogany Rush, Chilliwack, Q, and local bands. 21,000 people attended establishing a new park record.

Supertramp Days: WSAN/Allentown gave away autographed Supertramp albums in conjunction with the group's local concert. The station also spotlighted the music of the group.

10,000 Bumperstickers: That's how many WZMF/Milwaukee gave away in one day.

Doing Very Well But Not Perfect: WYDD/Pittsburgh's softball team is now 10-1.

Star Wars Albums were given away by WAAL/Binghamton (the home of Steve Becker) in conjunction with the film's local opening.

KMET/Los Angeles provided all day live reports from the Alice Cooper concert at Anaheim Stadium.

AOR Radio Outdoor Concert Tie-Ins

The Summer of '77 has barely begun and already AOR radio stations have been getting involved in numerous "Summer..." related live concert presentations. Many of these are taking place in the large stadiums and reports are that the sound systems are better and the crowds are mellower than in prior years. These concerts provide the stations with a variety of promotional activities from ticket giveaways to artist interviews and live spot coverage of related events.

KYYS (KY102)/Kansas City just pulled off one of the more spectacular of the Summer outdoor biggies. Approximately 42,000 music fans (SRO) filled the Kansas City Royals Stadium on Sunday (6/26) to see and hear Ted Nugent, the Little River Band, the Climax Blues Band, Reo Speedwagon, and Head East. The station lead up to the concert with 3 days of live breakaway coverage of the many phases of the show's preparation. Then to cap the activity in grand style, the entire 8½ hour concert was broadcast live over the station with reportedly tremendous sound fidelity. Dick Wilson, Jay Cooper, and PD Max Floyd conducted interviews with the artists during the sound checks and between the sets, as well as going into the crowd to talk with the people in attendance. Large speakers were set up in the parking lots, blasting both the station and the concert to the many folks engaging in "parking lot parties." While this was taking place on the ground, midday personality Stan Andrews went up in an airplane and broadcast live traffic reports to the many listeners clogging the roads to and from the stadium.

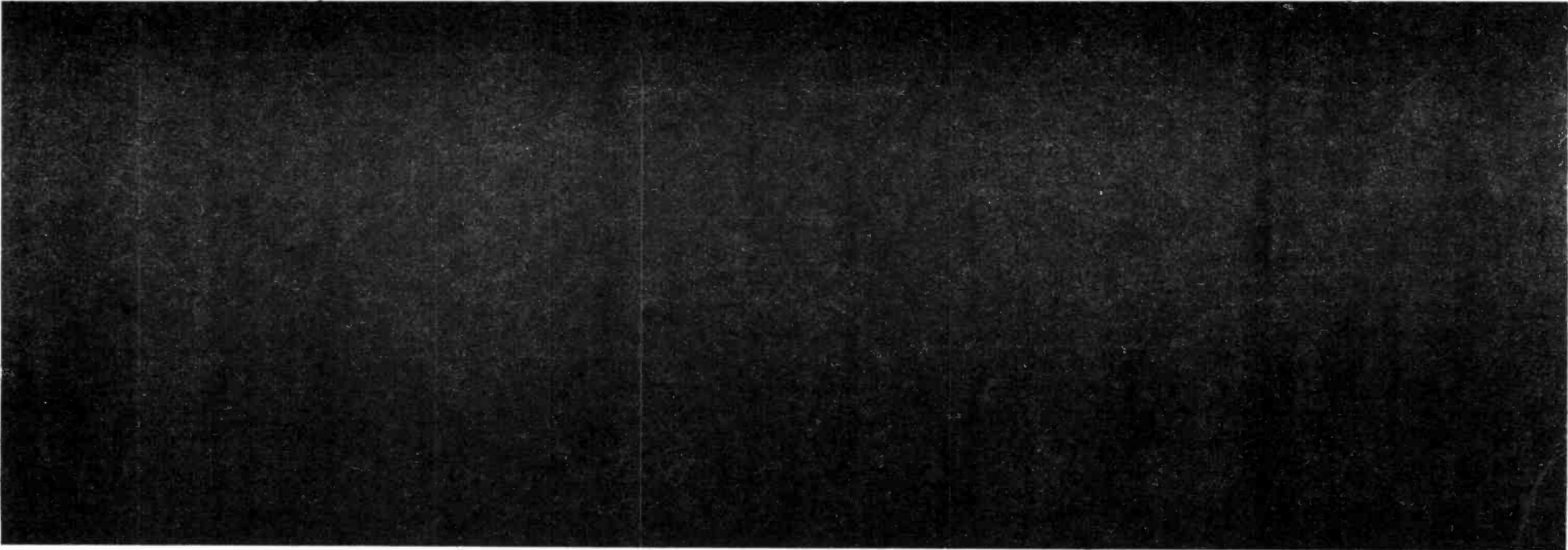
A double stage set-up kept the program moving and the concert actually got off to an early start (10 minutes).

Interesting Side Note: On Monday (6/27) the station was notified that a local ham radio operator had plugged the station into his rig and broadcast the concert to soldiers (and anyone else who wanted to listen) in Germany.

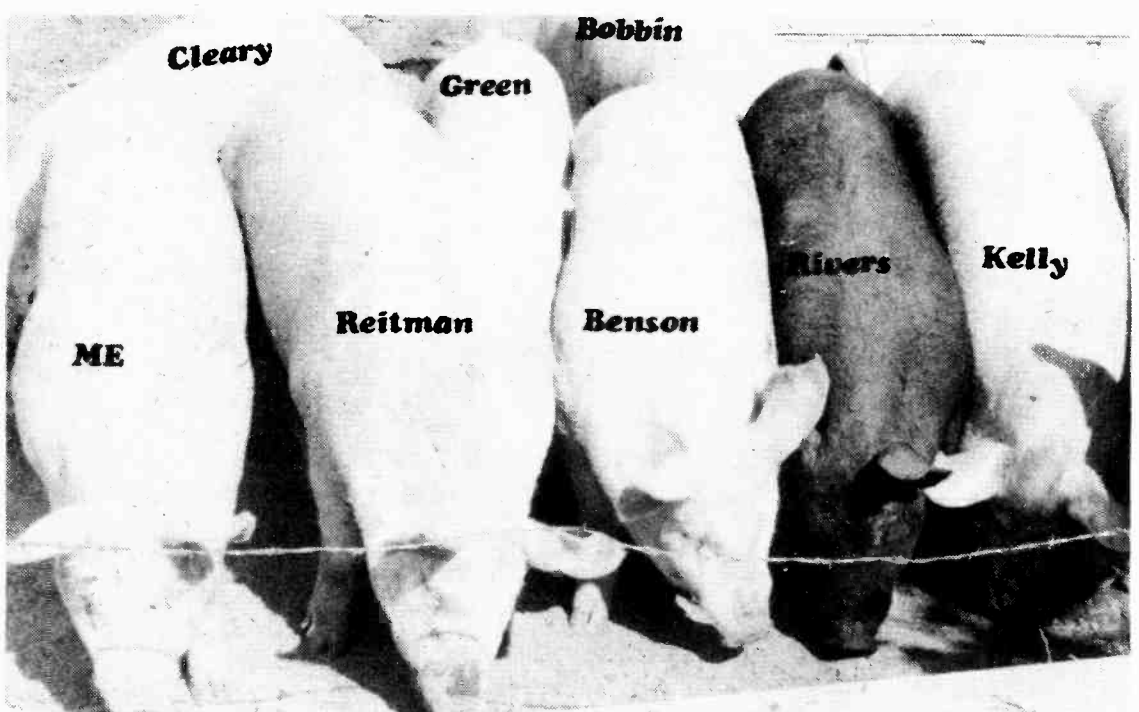

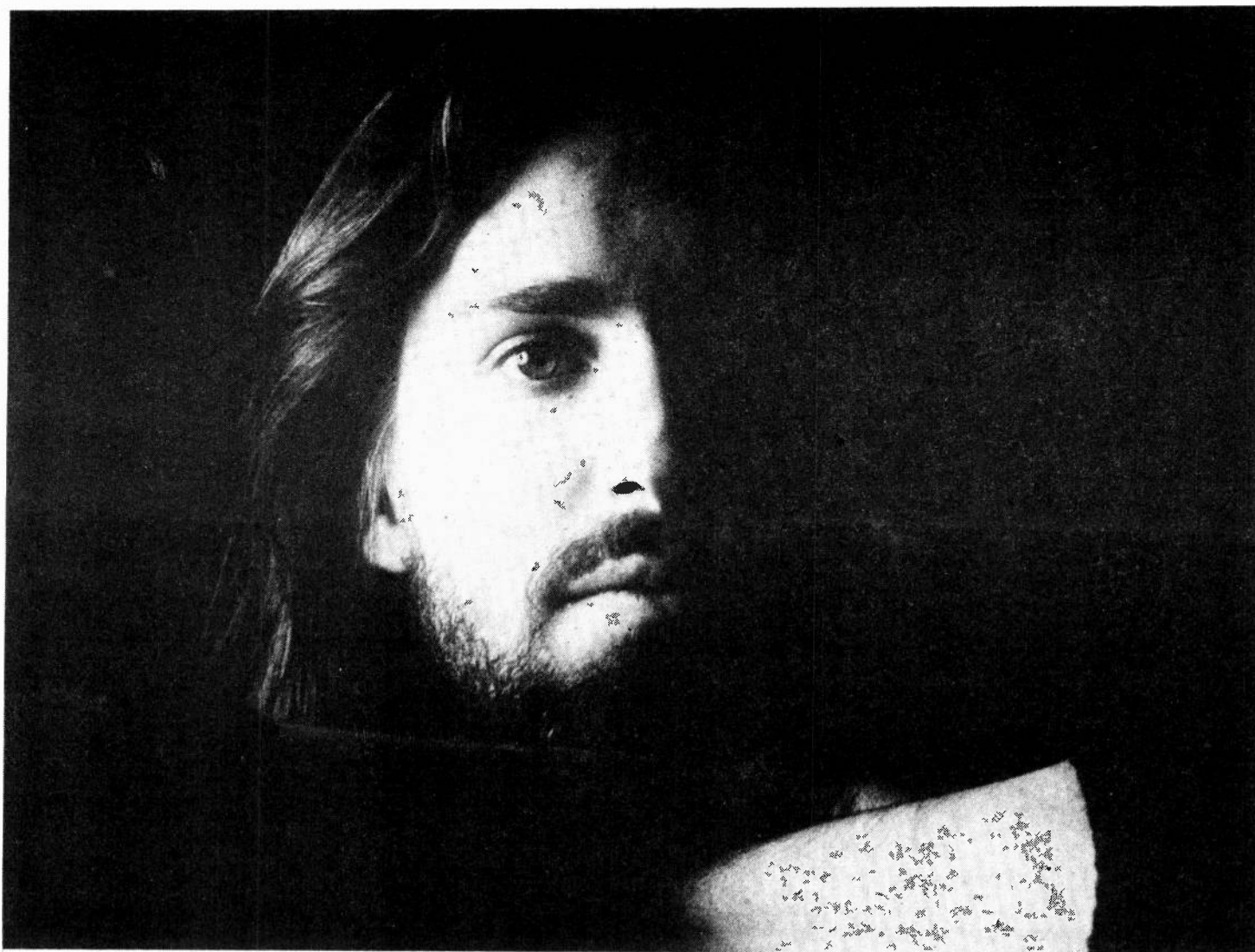
