It was a great success the last time...KJJJ/Phoenix morning personality BOBBY BUTLER is telling his listeners he will be taking on a "man eating chicken" at an upcoming circus. At the circus, there will be a staged fight between Butler and a man eating some chicken...KLAC/Los Angeles will be doing a summer-long weekend broadcast from Knott's Berry Farm, a West Coast amusement park. SAMMY JACKSON will broadcast Friday evenings, and yours truly, along with the semi-famous JIM DUNCAN, will do a show each Saturday night...As part of their "credit card" contest, WMC/Memphis is giving away a trip for two "back to the basics" in Luckenbach, Texas...WMAQ/Chicago afternoon drive personality, ELLIE DYLAN, hosted interviewer PHIL DONAHUE on her show recently...WBIR-FM/Knoxville just completed a "Get Tanked" promotion. RENEWAL ACTIONS

FCC DESIGNATES RENEWAL HEARING ON LOG VIOLATIONS

FCC has designated the WDRK(FM) (Greenville, O.) Renewal Application for a full hearing on issues involving its Maintenance and possible Falsification of its Program and Operating Logs. All Station should advisedly continue to take steps to assure the completeness and accuracy of their Logs and Logging Procedures.

FCC GRANTS SHORT-TERM RENEWAL FOR EEO VIOLATION

FCC granted a short-term Renewal of License to Station WABX (Detroit) finding that the Station employed no Blacks in full-time positions, although over 16% of the relevant SMSA was Black.

FCC RENEWS LICENSE AND DENIES COMPETING APPLICANT ON SITE AVAILABILITY

An FCC ALJ granted the Renewal Application of Station WFAA and KZEW(FM) (Dallas) over competing Applications for new AM and FM stations. He held that the competing Applicant had failed to show reasonable availability of a Transmitter Site (and could not rely on that of the existing Station), so that this fact made comparative considerations unnecessary.

FCC RENEWS LICENSE CITING AFFIRMATIVE EEO ACTION

FCC renewed for the remainder of its License Term Station WMMU (Greenville, S.C.) licensed to Bob Jones University, Inc. FCC had found EEO derelictions in the 1974 Renewal, but concluded from its recent **Annual Employment Reports**, that the percentage of Minorities had reached the "zone of reasonableness."

FCC REFUSES HEARING ON FORMAT CHANGE

FCC denied a request for a Hearing on a License Assignment Application for WKLX (Portsmouth, Va.) where Assignee proposed to change an "All News" format to "Country and Western" insofar as the change was justified because of severe financial losses under the old News format.

FCC GRANTS TRANSFER OVER PROTEST ON FORMAT CHANGE

Similarly, FCC refused to stay its grant of transfer of WTIC-AM-FM (Hartford), and refused to order Transferor (in the process of changing its format from Classical to Popular Music) to maintain a partial Classical Format in the evenings, pending FCC action on a Petition for Reconsideration of the grant.

FCC DENIES WRONGDOING LICENSEE INTERIM AUTHORITY

WSIB (Beaufort, S.C.) whose License had been revoked for misrepresentations, was denied authority by FCC to continue operating the Station, pending a proposed sale to a Black Community Ownership Group. Otherwise, it found, would be to undermine the deterrent effect of revocation, and benefit a wrongdoer.

FCC DENIES FAIRNESS COMPLAINT

FCC reaffirmed its earlier Ruling denying a Fairness Complaint against WWL-TV (New Orleans) on finding Complainant failed to show that the Issue (appointment of a Judge) was so critical, controversial or significant as to make unreasonable WWL-TV's conclusion not to cover it.

FCC RECOMMENDS CONGRESS REVISE SECTION 315

FCC in a lukewarm 3-2 vote, decided to recommend to Congress that it revise the Equal Time provision of the Communications Act by exempting Station coverage of Presidential and Vice Presidential Candidates whereas there is presently no such exemption in the Act.

NRBA To Advise Arbitron

The **National Radio Broadcasters Association** and **Arbitron** announced a plan to work together on issues crucial to the radio industry. According to NRBA Director-at-Large **Ted Dorf**, the NRBA ratings committee will review complaints about rating services, and will then meet with Arbitron management to evaluate significant grievances. The NRBA and Arbitron will also work together to evolve corrective procedures for the improvement of overall service to the industry. "In this manner," stated Dorf, "the NRBA will ensure that the voice of its over-1000 radio station members will be represented in those matters directly related to audience measurement." The NRBA has also offered to assist Arbitron with regard to audience diary security, unauthorized Arbitron report use, and the discouragement of diary hyping.
