

Autumn busts in like a coaster

It is coming, a day cut like a warm slab of blue sky and green pastureland. The yellow line on the road leads you through sheep pastures and old farms. The distant trees beyond the gold-stubbed cornfield wrap the world in colored leaves, one last brave burst of color before winter sets in.

You can see it in the Upper Peninsula, where you go down Highway 2 through gold and yellow and rise up, up like a roller coaster through maple leaf red. You can see it bursting in sumac and oak and yellow aspen in the northern Lower Peninsula, and you can watch it run away in a great glowing carpet of leaves in the Irish Hills.

There are, of course, other places to go for your annual dose of autumn leaves: Maupintours has a 10-day escorted fall foliage tour of New England, and Green Mountain Holidays will guide you on a bicycle tour through Vermont; you can attend the Wo-Za-Wa Fall Festival of color in Wisconsin Dells or the various fall festivals in northern Wisconsin.

But if you would like to do it in Michigan, try these: the Au Sable River Queen paddleboat color tour from Oscoda, weekdays at noon, or weekends at 10:30 a.m., noon, 1, 2:30 and 3:30 p.m. weekends for \$5.25 (\$2.75 for children). That is at the Foote Dam or the Five Channels Darp off Highway 65 near US-23.

Or...The Color Cruise and Island Festival in Grand Ledge, Oct. 16-18. nobody knows when the color will arrive, but it is usually in southeastern Michigan from the last week in September through the third week in October, and of course it is earlier the further north you go. The toll-free hotline number, in season, will be 1-800-248-5700.

Cincinnati holds 'the nation's largest outdoor Oktoberfest, Sept. 19-20. Activities surround Fountain Square, its fountain appropriately built in Munich, Germany, and includes all the beer-thumping-singing, dancing and fun of a festival that likes to call itself the "Oktoberfest Zinzinnati."

The famous Kitchener-Waterloo Oktoberfest will be held Oct. 9-17 in Ontario, and a number of smaller Ontario Oktoberfests will accompany it from the sidelines: Hamilton, Oct. 2-3; and Niagara Falls, Oct. 2. The annual Grape and Wine Festival is Sept. 19-20 in St. Catherine's, Ontario.

Going west? There are festivals this weekend in Nauvoo, Kewanee, Princeton and Arcola; Ill.; second weekend of September in Murphysboro, Morton, Pekin and Monmouth; third weekend in Lincoln and last weekend in September in Clinton, Bishop Hall, and at the Navy Pier in Chicago.

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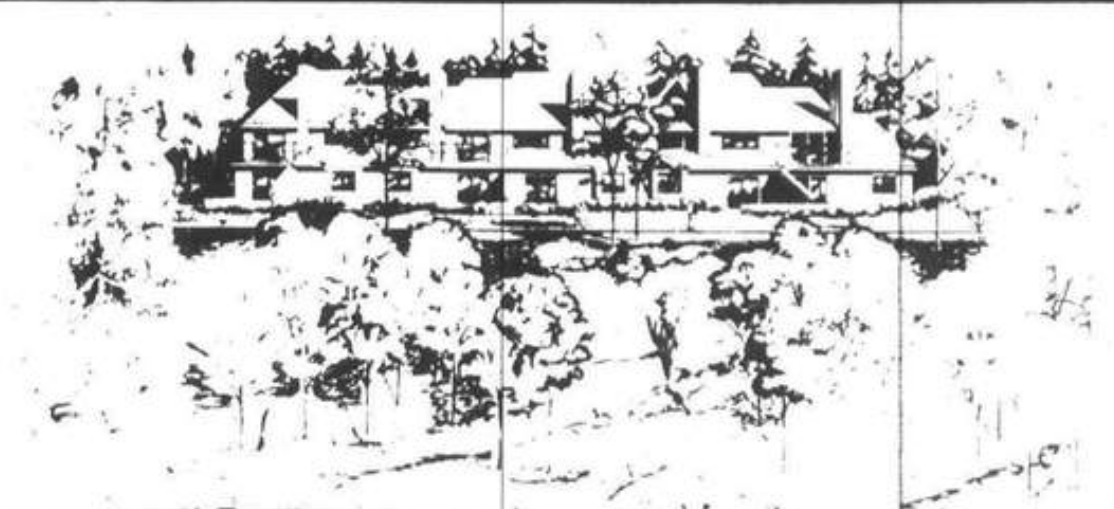

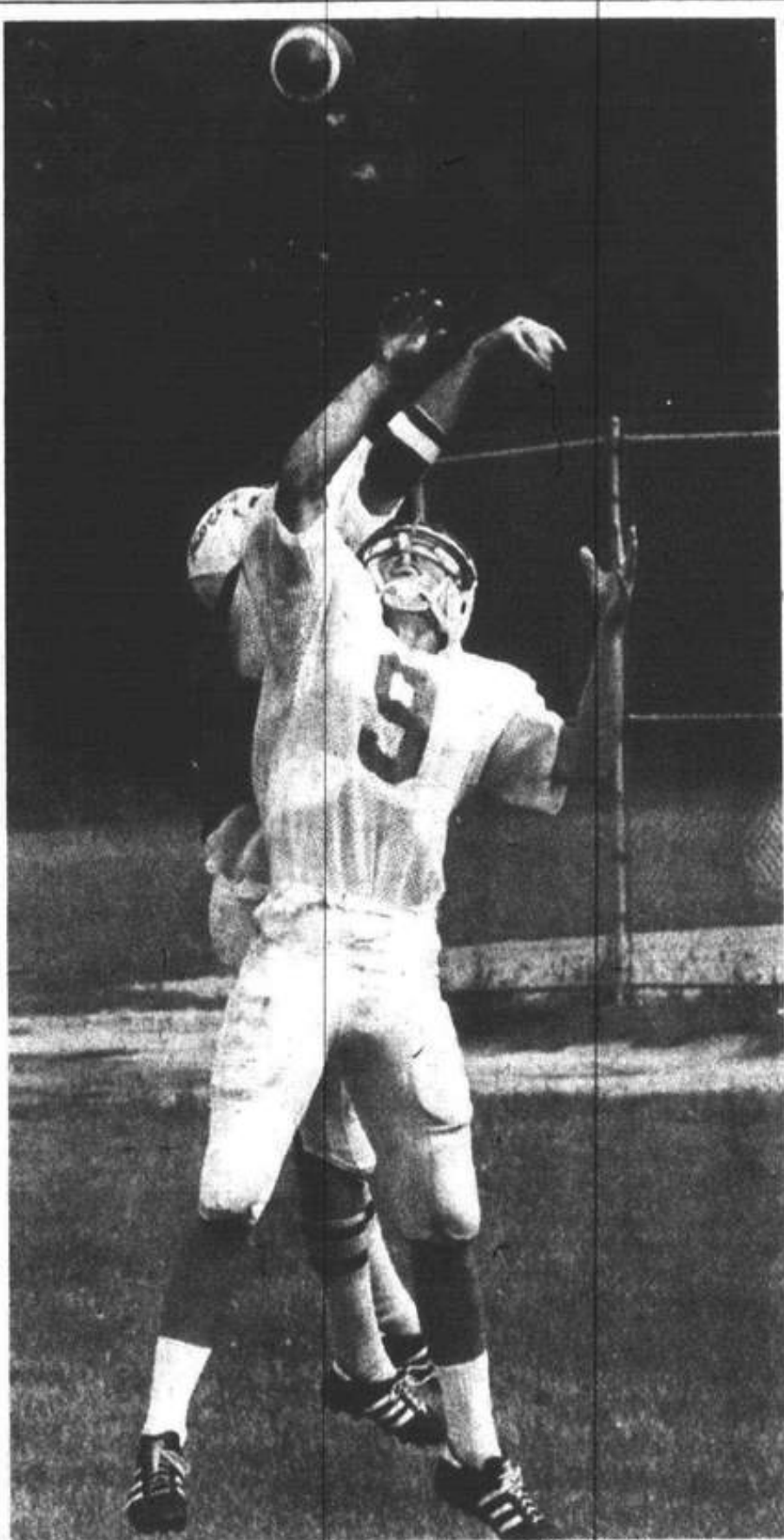
Geri Starrs opened the scoring when she rammed a loose ball past the Bloomfield goaltender late in the first half.

Plymouth girls dominate field in SEMTA event

Age was no barrier in the initial SEMTA Closed Tennis Championships held Sunday at the Metropolitan Racquet Club in Detroit.

Chris Gilles, 14, of Plymouth outlasted a field of 32 invited players to win the women's singles crown.

A sophomore at Plymouth Salem, Gilles defeated 16-year-old Rene Krickstein of Grosse Pointe Shores 6-4, 6-3.

Chris' sister, Wendy, 13, also made a strong showing. She reached the semifinals before losing to Krickstein 6-1, 6-4.

The tournament, held on a clay surface, also drew 32 of the men's top players from the Southeastern Michigan Tennis Association area.

In the men's final, former University of Michigan netter Ihor Debryn of Grosse Pointe downed Detroit's Michael Reese in straight sets.

Gilles, who was named to the Detroit News' Prep All-Metro team last fall, opened play with a 6-1, 6-0 victory over Wayne State University netter Cindy Hill.

SHE THEN proceeded to beat Kathy Kantsman of Mt. Clemens 6-0, 6-4; Patti Roth of Rochester 7-6, 7-6; and Chris Nagel of West Bloomfield 6-2, 6-2.

Roth, wife of PGA pro Jeff Roth, formerly of Plymouth, used a patient base-line ground game to force a pair of tie breakers before succumbing to Gilles.

Meanwhile, Wendy scored victories over Sandy Alexander of Detroit, 6-0, 6-0; Denise Sherwood of Riverview, 6-0, 6-3; and Marianne Ring of Bloomfield Hills, default.

Earlier in the week, Chris won the Deer Lake Racquet Club's Junior Open in the Girls' 18 division with a 6-0, 6-1 triumph over Janet Ray of Livonia. She gained the final with a 6-1, 6-0 victory over Southfield's Janice Martin.

In the Girls' 16 division, Wendy captured the crown with a 6-3, 6-2 victory over Birmingham's Clare Slaughter. Julie Goldsmith of Southfield fell to Gilles in the semifinal, 6-0, 6-3.

Sports without nicknames?

A paper is thrust in your face. Glancing at it, you see what awaits you.

You'll be thrown to the bears Friday. Whatever the outcome, that encounter will be followed with a fight against panthers one week later. Then will come attacks by hawks and raiders, followed by a swarm of yellow jackets.

So what do you do? Attack — after all, you're a tiger.

This world of sports nicknames can be a vicious place. The violence attached to certain sports nicknames is traceable in the history of sport itself.

According to Dr. R. Brasch's book, "How Did Sports Begin", sports started as "a religious cult and a preparation for life. Its roots were in man's desire to gain victory over foes seen and unseen, to influence the forces of nature and to promote fertility among his crops and cattle."

The word sport is an abbreviation of the word disport, meaning a diversion and an amusement.

Religious ceremonies? Fertility rites? Amusing diversions? If that's what ancient sports were like, they didn't stay that way long.

FOOTBALL WAS devised in England. The game was what we now call soccer, and it was simple to play — construct two goals, find something to use as a ball and choose up sides.

Early games were violent, but pregame ceremonies were worse. Legend has it that in ancient English times they used the severed head of a conquered foe as the ball. Some amusement.

Violence caused King Edward II of England to ban the game in 1314. Games got out of hand, with some 500 persons participating and using entire towns as the field.

Nicknames arose from the people playing the game. The Old Blackheathens were one of the first football clubs in England, formed in 1862 and named after the town they were from.

Soccer had by then already spread to the states. On Nov. 6, 1869, Rutgers beat Princeton, 6-4, in the first American collegiate football (soccer) match.

To distinguish themselves from the Princeton players, Rutgers team members wore red jerseys. To this day, scarlet is still Rutgers' school color and their nickname remains "the Scarlet".

BUT WHATEVER happened to the religious rites associated with sport? The first Olympics were dedicated to the ancient Greek gods. But in later times teams never adopted religious nicknames.

Why weren't there any Cambridge Clerics? Nicknames, like sport itself, became less serious as time

went on. While games were taken seriously, people no longer thought of them as influencing the growth of crops or the amount of rainfall. Nicknames became fierce or even boastful.

Certain schools in the O&E coverage area stick to the ancient concept of fear-inspiring nicknames.

There are Spartans (Livonia Stevenson and Redford Bishop Borgess), Raiders (North Farmington), Warriors (Birmingham Brother Rice), Chiefs (Plymouth Canton) and Panthers (Redford Union and Garden City East).

Sports teams' nicknames can also convey some historical significance.

The first baseball club in America was the New York Knickerbockers, named after a type of pants worn by Dutch settlers.

In O&E land, there are the Patriots (Livonia Franklin and Redford Temple Christian), the Westland John Glenn Rockets and even the Plymouth Salem Rocks.

Noble peoples of the past inspired the Bloomfield Andover Barons, the Bloomfield Lahser Knights and the Rochester Adams Highlanders.

HOWEVER, THERE'S always exceptions to the rule. Several schools in O&E land disdained past reasoning when choosing their nicknames.

Instilling fear into opponents did not inspire such team tags as Gazelles (Bloomfield Sacred Heart), Cranes (Bloomfield Cranbrook), Blue Jays (Southfield), Aardvarks (Bloomfield Kingswood) or Marlins (Farmington Mercy).

These animals are not feared predators. They are more often the quarry than the hunter.

There are other local nicknames which one must guess the reasoning behind.

Birmingham Seaholm is the Maples — is that a reference to a deep-rooted commitment to excellence?

Detroit/Catholic Central apparently thrives on luck, so their sports teams carry the name of Shamrocks.

Lakers? What the heck is a Laker, anyway — someone who lives in a lake? Hopefully, someone at West Bloomfield knows.

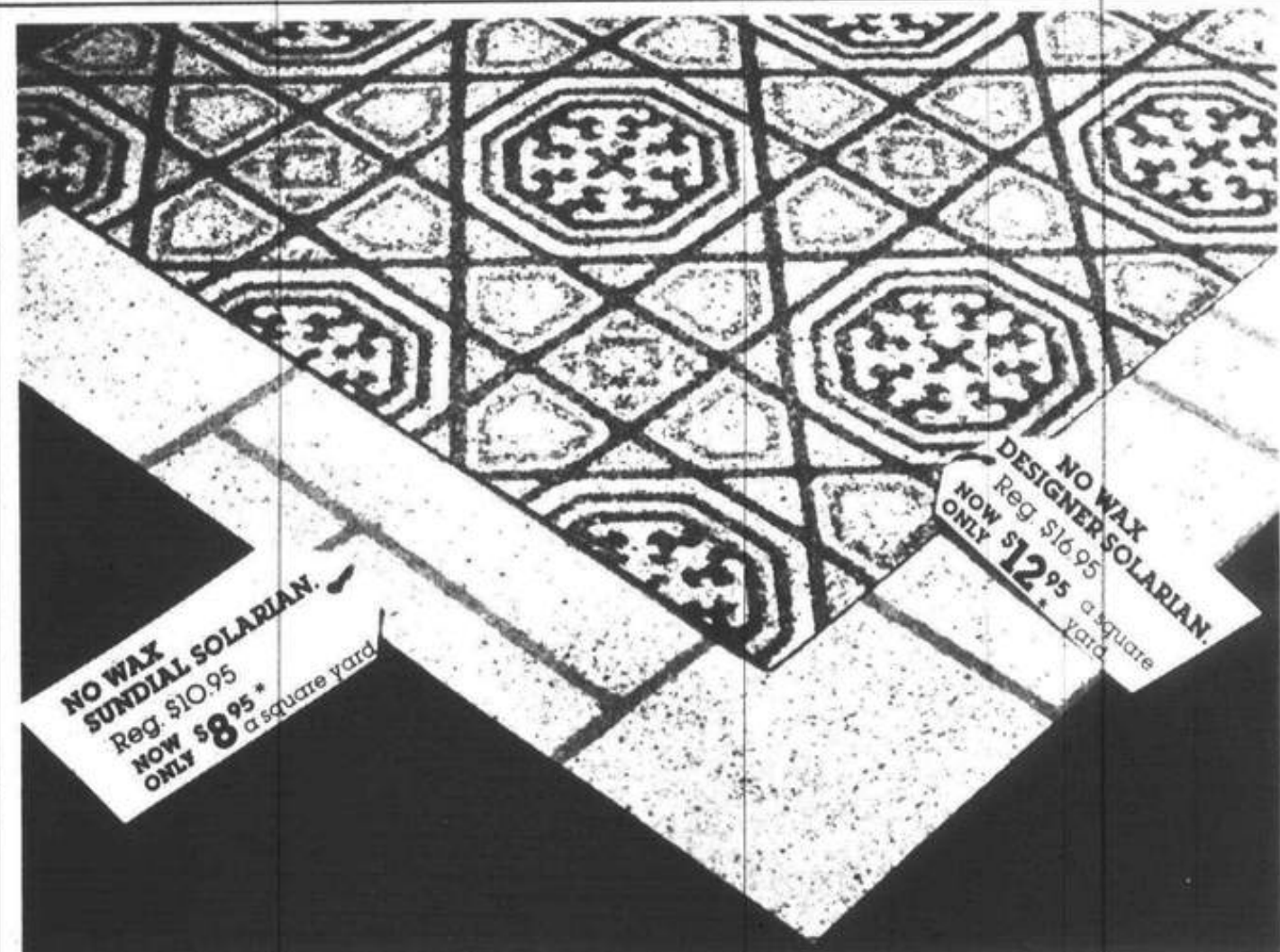
Others are confusing — like the Livonia Ladywood Blazers. Does it mean a trailblazer, a blazing flame, or a jacket?

Whoever invented the first sports team nickname could never have foreseen that.

Young team seeks turnabout

Tom Moshimer makes no promises, but things could be a lot different around Centennial Educational Park this year.

The Plymouth Salem football coach is not junking his beloved wishbone offense. He just wants to experiment a little bit.

"We're going to try to open it up," he said, "but I said that last year. We tried but couldn't get it done."

The Rocks slipped somewhat last season and ended up with a disappointing 4-5 record, but the Salem coach predicts better days ahead, despite a brutal schedule. The team's opener is Saturday, Sept. 12 at Livonia Franklin.

"Our attitude has been super," said Moshimer. "They've hustled in practice. There's good team unity and no class divisions."

"I've had no problems discipline-wise. They want to turn it around. They don't like that 4-and-5 business."

Salem is basically young, especially at the skilled positions, according to Moshimer.

The Rocks, however, have experience at quarterback with the return of senior Jeff Hubert (6-feet, 184 pounds), who showed a strong arm last year as a starter.

Moshimer also believes he has some capable back-ups in senior Kirk Soluk (5-11, 170), one of the team's co-captains, and juniors Pete Steyaert and Dave Haut.

"I feel comfortable with any of the four throwing the football," said Moshimer.

HE ALSO believes that if Hubert gets ample time to pass, the balls will be caught.

Junior tight ends Dave Houle (6-4, 200) and Bob DeBenedet are qualified along with split ends Geoff Baker (5-10, 135), Tom Schmidt and Jeff Teddar.

Baker, a senior, is one of the few returning starters.

When the ball is not in the air, expect to see senior fullback Darrel Bartkowiak (5-11, 213) and junior halfback Dave Slavin (6-0, 192) carrying the load.

Bartkowiak is one of the team's keys for 1981. He'll also start at linebacker.

"Darrel's a good all-around player," said the Salem coach. "He'll make them play us honest."

Sophomore Scott Jurek will back up Bartkowiak while John Blanchard, a senior, Mickey Madsen, a junior, and Ken Harmon, a sophomore, hope to make inroads for the halfback job.

Marty Piper (6-3, 215), a senior, started all nine games last year at offensive and defensive tackle. Also an outstanding heavyweight wrestler, Piper plans to go both ways again.

Four seniors have nailed down starting spots on the offensive line — Pat Tortora (6-0, 180), center; Joe Roberts and Bruno Genrich, guards; and Doug Galliers, tackle.

BACK-UPS on the offensive line include guards Dan McDonald, Matt Ruhlman and Mike Moshimer. Keith Urban, a junior, will play behind Tortora, and another junior, Joe Hulack, is a reserve tackle.

"Our team speed?," said Moshimer. "Fair. We have some fairly quick kids and have five guys who can catch the ball."

Defensively, the Rocks will give their opponents the basic 5-2 alignment.

Bartkowiak and Slavin anchor the linebackers with DeBenedet and Matt Broderick, a junior, in reserve.

Up front will be Tortora, nose guard; Piper and Galliers, tackles; Houle and Roberts, ends.

Ruhlman and Schmidt can also play nose guard. Ken Bemiss and Tom Walkley, a junior, provide reserve strength at tackle. Genrich and Jurek

will play the defensive end spots.

The secondary is solid with the return of Hubert (cornerback), Soluk (free safety) and Baker (strong safety). Other defensive backfield hopefuls are senior John Bevelheimer, Madsen, Haut and Steyaert.

"We'll give a lot of multiple looks," said the Salem coach. "We'll angle and play straight. I think we'll be a decent defensive football team."

One of the biggest voids to fill is placekicking and punting, left vacant by the graduation of Brian Lewandowski.

Mark Blaesser, a senior, will handle field goals, kickoffs and extra points. Slavin and Madsen are contesting for the punting job.

MOSHIMER believes this year's Suburban Eight League race, which is also the last because of league re-alignments in 1982, is going to be competitive.

"You've got to put Trenton (last year's defending champs) and Edsel Ford right up there," he said. "Dearborn will be fair again."

"In our league we'll be small. A lot depends on injuries. We'll have to wait and see. We may not be great, but we'll come to play."

And may be a little different.

Net pro schools juniors

Curt Condon uses therapy for junior tennis players.

The 28-year-old pro from Singing Hills Golf and Tennis Club of El Cajon, Calif., recently conducted a clinic at Schoolcraft College, stressing the "mental aspects" of the game.

Elesse U.S.A. and Nike sales representative Tom Seavey of Southfield made arrangements for Condon to address students in Schoolcraft's junior development program.

"I make it as simple as possible and practice with a purpose in mind," said Condon.

"You've got to make it fun. We play a lot of games. I have them try to accomplish a task so they can master another

goal and then reach that. It's very systematic."

And how does Condon's philosophy differ from the rest of the teaching pros?

"Basically we all say the same thing," he said. "It's the way you communicate with kids. I tell them when or when not to hit a certain shot. I try to give more insight."

Singing Hills, a resort complex, has housed several nationally ranked junior players including West Bloomfield's Ed Nagel and Aaron Krickstein of Grosse Pointe.

"I teach all levels," said Condon, "and the main thing is to have fun."

"We work on fundamentals. I want them to get the ball across the net. I stress the baseline, first."

JUNIOR TENNIS today is often viewed as a minor league system for

the pros. Some players, if they're good enough to qualify for national tournaments, do extensive traveling.

"I haven't seen so much pressure as there is in junior tennis," Condon said. "Most of the time it's because of the parents. The pressure from them is often way out of proportion. A lot of them try to live their lives through their kids. They feel they might be helping, but they're really hindering."

Condon also has coached several nationally ranked junior tennis players like John McEnroe.

"A guy like (Bjorn) Borg was handled the right way at the grass roots," said Condon. "You have to do it at the junior level or you're going to have problems."

"If they act up, I wouldn't let them play for a month, especially if it's a nationally ranked player."

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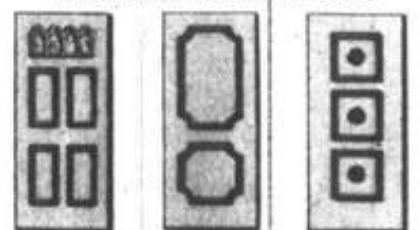
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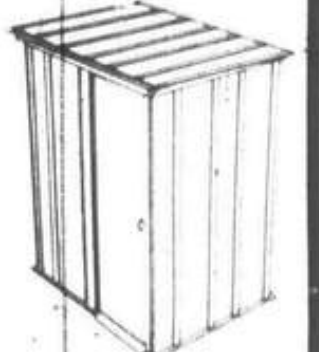
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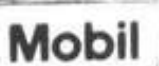
