Primary of several pencils (P1135, P1135N, P2135, Q535) that bear the Kerry name.

The P1035A Black Kerry is a match for the R1000 Excalibur Rolling Writer Pen (US) / RX30 Excalibur Roll-Alloy Pen (Japan). In the US, it was available with the matching R1000 in the Excalibur Gift Set RX1000 in the early-80's.

Intended by Pentel as "a pencil to be used as a fountain pen" the new 5 (now with a cap) was nicknamed Kelly by Japanese users, pronouncing "carry" the way Japanese speakers do when saying English words.

When Pentel decided to drop the 5 to replace it with the name users preferred, they went with the "Kerry" variant, thinking of the international market. [per u/First-Sail-1386 on Reddit]

The mannenCIL is another name the Kerries are sometimes referred to in Japan - this comes from the fact that fountain pens are called 万年筆 (Man-nen-hitsu) in Japan, where 万年 means 10,000 years, and 筆 means brush/pen. As the original capped design of the Kerry came from copying capped fountain pen designs, the original Kerry was also called 万年CIL (Man-nen-CIL), with the CIL coming from the last 3 letters of the English word "pencil" - 10,000 year pencil! [per @Mecha on Knockology]

Late-70's to early-80's pencils had the Date Code stamped on the lead reservoir in the yymmdd format. I believe the Date Code is still on the lead reservoir, just harder to read, when Pentel switched to the 2-character code.
